### Multicultural Britain and United States

Both Britain and the United States are multicultural societies.

In the United States, the white people whose ancestors came from Europe in the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries form the mainstream. In Britain, the mainstream consists of the white population from England, Wales, Scotland, and Ireland. In North America, the ethnic minorities are composed of other racial and cultural groups: the Native Americans, African Americans, the Hispanics, and the Asian Americans are the main ethnic minorities. In Britain, the ethnic minorities include the families of former immigrants from South Asia, China, the Caribbean, and from many other countries.

When their ancestors settled in Britain, they tried to preserve their cultural traditions. Nowadays, even though most members of the ethnic minority groups think of themselves as British, they take pride in their cultural origins and keep alive their traditional festivals and practices. Many people from the mainstream also enjoy such cultural events.

In the United States, the African-American, the Hispanic, and the Asian populations are growing faster than the white one. In a near future, these ethnic groups will account for about 50% of the population. The US government has made English the official language in the whole country in an attempt to force the immigrants to fit into the "melting pot."


**b)** Read the following text. Study the graph and then draw the missing part from the information in the text.

During the period from 1970 to 2000, the world's population growth rate declined slightly, from 2.0% in mid-1970s to about 1.8% in early 1980s. And it decreased very slightly from the 1980s to the year 2000, when it reached 1.7%.

The rate of population growth in China fell sharply from 26% (in 1970) to about 11% in early 1990s and 9% in 2000.

The population growth rate in Europe has also dropped during this period. It was about 1% in the early seventies, and it rose gradually to about 1.2% by the early eighties. Then it declined slightly to 1% by 2000.

(Note: The figures above are in approximation.)


